## **Report to Members**

Dear Hurstville Security District Member,

We hope your holidays were safe and pleasant! As your Board of Commissioners for the Hurstville Security District, we are happy to report that crime in the area has remained low over the past few years. We believe this is due in large part to your continued diligence in reporting suspicious activity and our patrol officers' work in the area.

We are equally pleased to report that the security fee for the coming year will remain steady at \$455 as in the past few years. This allows us to provide 105 hours per service each week to you and your family. As a reminder, the HSD patrol is always on duty between the hours of 5:00 pm til 1:00 am. each day. The balance of the assignments are determined by our supervisor, Lt. Carl Perillioux who follows the trends of the overall crime in the city and the 2<sup>nd</sup> District, and deploys officers accordingly. The mix of undercover, unmarked and marked NOPD cars and officers has proven effective for this neighborhood in keeping crime under wraps. And each patrol officer is equipped with a radio and GPS system to assure accountability

## **Hurstville Security and Neighborhood Improvement District Patrol Statistics 2008-2010**

The statistics below show the patrol activity within our HSD boundaries since the beginning of the security district.

Notes: Three of the four vehicular burglaries occurred on unlocked vehicles. There was one purse snatching that occurred but is not noted as a traditionally tracked crime. The kidnap/rape reported a few weeks ago is listed by NOPD as having occurred just outside of the HSD boundaries thus is not included above.
