Dear Hurstville Security District Resident,

We hope your Holiday Season continues to be safe and happy!

We are again pleased to report that crime in the area has remained low over the year. Patrol hours have been increased to approximately 140 hours per week, or 20 hours per day.

Officers are always on duty between the hours of 5 pm - 2 am and from 6am - 11am. Our supervisor, Lt. Carl Perillioux, monitors crime trends in the 2^{nd} District and proactively deploys additional officers to protect the Security District. The mix of undercover and marked NOPD cars and officers has proven effective.

Each patrol officer is equipped with a cell phone (upgraded) and a radio to ensure immediate contact with each other and with Hurstville Members. Our GPS tracking system has also been improved and provides accountability.

NEW! For Your Car

Enclosed are two new static cling stickers for your car windshield. They go on the inside, and peel on and off. Please put them near your brake tag to keep the Security District Patrol phone number handy.

Don't forget to call the security patrol to meet you when you go to and from your home. Many of your neighbors already do! Remind your family and guests to do the same.

HSD Patrol Activity

The statistics below show the patrol activity within our HSD boundaries since the beginning of the Security District. Even during Mardi Gras and Hurricane Isaac this year, there was no increase in criminal activity in the HSD area.

In 2012 (as of December 11), our HSD patrols handled over 36 residence alarms, 38 auto alarms, 2 business alarms, 1449 pedestrian checks, 3362 residence checks, 97 business checks and 993 vehicle checks.
