**RESOLUTION NO. 2021-02
To Adopt A Plan for 2022**

WHEREAS, pursuant to Act 151 of the 2007 Regular Session of the Louisiana State Legislature, codified at La.R.S. 33:9091.11 (as amended by the Amendment, as defined below, the “Act”), The Hurstville Security and Neighborhood Improvement District, (hereinafter referred to as “District”) a security and improvement district of the state of Louisiana, was created; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the aforesaid Act, the affairs of the District is managed by a Board of Commissioners consisting of nine members (the “Board”); and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act authorized the New Orleans City Council to impose and collect a fee on each parcel of ground located within the district subject to the question of imposition of such fee being approved by a majority of registered voters of the District voting at an election for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the imposition of a fee was approved by the registered voters of the District;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Act 49 of the 2013 Regular Session of the Louisiana State Legislature (the “Amendment”), the District’s authority to impose and collect a fee was extended until December 31, 2022, subject to approval by the registered voters residing in the District; and

WHEREAS, the registered voters residing in the District approved a continuation of the authority of the District to levy the authorized annual fee which, commencing January 1, 2015 is not to exceed a maximum per year of five hundred fifty dollars (\$550.00) plus twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for each calendar year after 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes the amount of the fee to be as requested by a duly adopted resolution of the Board, subject to the foregoing limitation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Board is required to adopt for the District an annual budget and plan in accordance with applicable law, including the Louisiana Local Government Budget Act, La. R.S. 39:1301 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires that the Council of the City of New Orleans levy and collect a parcel fee of \$530 on each improved taxable parcel of real property within the District, and add such fee to the property bills to be issued by the City of New Orleans to the owners of the property within the District that is subject to the fee for the tax year commencing 2022;

WHEREAS, in connection with the City Council’s levy and collection of the aforesaid \$530 parcel fee it is necessary and appropriate that the Board first adopt a plan, hold a public hearing and adopt a budget of revenues and expenditures for 2022 which indicates how the proceeds of the aforesaid \$530 parcel fee will be expended in accordance with the Act; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE HURSTVILLE SECURITY AND NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT THAT the following plan for 2022 indicates how the proceeds of the aforesaid \$530 parcel fee on the City’s billing report of 2022 showing 763 eligible district properties will be expended for the purposes permitted in the Act:

1. Plan

The District plans to provide security services within the District including patrolling and escort services. The District also plans to provide ancillary administrative and support services to facilitate the security services being provided. The estimated annual cost of providing such services in 2022 is \$364,700 which the District estimates will be expended as such:


